Difficulty – these are outdoor activities and may require hiking, climbing, and other physical activities. Please recognize your level of ability and be responsible for your own safety.

Cancellations – a minimum of 72 hours advance notice for cancellations. Refunds will be based on the refund policy of the location.

Fishing on the Pecos River – all day trip with fly fishing guide. Hosted by Terry Rothwell. Bring your fly fishing gear, New Mexico fishing license, and a picnic lunch.

Georgia O'Keeffe House Tour in Abiquiu – all day trip. Hosted by Ann Church. We will tour the O'Keeffe House in the morning and then go to Ghost Ranch to enjoy a hike and a picnic lunch. Bring a lunch or purchase food at Bodies Market. Activity level at house – minimal, activity at Ghost Ranch – moderate to more strenuous, depends on hike, which you can opt out.

Puye Cliffs – Hosted by Michelle and Terry Rothwell and Ann Church. Tour the Puye Cliffs with a native guide, afterwards, stop at Okay Owinge to visit Roxanne Swintzel's Tower. Activity level – vigorous, includes hiking and climbing. Requirements – none except for ticket purchase, bring water, wear comfortable walking/hiking boots.
